Pastor's Column

To the Parishioners of Our Lady of Lourdes & St. Michael:

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This follows on the heels of Pentecost Sunday, which was last Sunday, and is followed next Sunday with the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). Three solemnities, all in a row.

Since Pentecost we are now in the midst of "Ordinary Time" in the Church calendar. We can usually tell Ordinary Time by the predominant use of green vestments and it is the longest liturgical season of the Church Year. For many of us this

time means the time for no school, vacations, travel, or summer jobs. Pope Benedict said that "Ordinary Time does not mean that the commitment of Christians must diminish; quite the contrary, having entered divine life through the sacraments, we are now called to remain open to the action grace in order to grow in love towards God and neighbor."

The Church is preparing us for ordinary time with these Solemnities. They offer us the opportunity to reflect and pray

on the mysteries of our faith. When we are on vacation or travel, we break our routines of daily living in all sorts of ways. New sights and sounds, families together all day (!) and not just at breakfast or dinner; maybe the chance to really relax, read, or play games. There are blessings in our lives we often take for granted. Our commitment to worship and honor God does not go away, even when we are on vacation. God's grace is still working in the sacraments we receive. We can still grow in love towards our neighbors and to God. Maybe the best time to contemplate the mysteries of God, of his love for us, and the graces and blessings all around us is when we have broken our routines, if for a little while, when we are on vacation. We can recharge our spiritual batteries. We don't have to focus on all the negative, but on the goodness all around us.

Yes, the Trinity is the deepest of all the mysteries of our faith. Three persons who are one God. As our Preface will say, "You are one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person but in a trinity of one substance." There is God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Everything that exists, ourselves, the galaxies, the earth, even the cells, atoms and particles exist because of the action of The Trinity. They are in perfect relation to each other and yet each has a role to play in the history of salvation. These Solemnities offer the chance to reflect on how generous and good God has been to us even when things do not go our way.

In this Ordinary Time may we take time to thank God for all the blessings of this life and for offering us a "Trinity of love" to carry us to heaven. The more we think about it, there is nothing ordinary about ordinary time.

BISHOP CONSECRATES DIOCESE TO SACRED HEART OF JESUS

All people of the Diocese are invited to a special Mass at 7 p.m. Thursday, June 26, at the Cathedral of the Incarnation in Nashville where Bishop David Choby will consecrate the Diocese to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

In preparation for the consecration, families are encouraged to start a Novena on Sunday, June 15. A novena may be found at www.ewtn.com/devotionals/heart/sh_novena.htm.

The Sacred Heart devotion is associated with Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, who was asked by Christ in a

vision to spread a devotion of expiatory love to counter the ingratitude of mankind. The feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated on June 27.

In the Mass, Bishop Choby will lead the congregation in the prayer of consecration of the Diocese's clergy, religious, families and youth. Some of the others consecrated in the prayer include the military, police, firemen, health care workers, prisoners, homeless, orphans and those who are sick.

FORTNIGHT FOR FREEDOM

The U.S. Catholic Bishops are again calling on the faithful to participate in a two-week campaign to protect religious liberties from government infringement from June 21 to July 4.

Catholics are encouraged to dedicate the two-week period to prayer, study, catechesis and public action to help protect religious freedom.
