Over the next year the formation class was selected. It began with 120 men and was “whittled” down to the 29 men who were ordained into Holy orders on June 9th. After the first year in the selection process, we spent every Tuesday and Thursday nights at Aquinas College. Beginning with the rich history of the Catholic Church leading all the way to Canon law we were exposed to more information than my limited brain could take in and remember. Nonetheless, as I begin this next step I will continue to learn and take in what our Church has to offer its people and I will, with the grace of God, serve our parishes.

As ordination became a reality, I was overwhelmed with how unworthy I am to receive that sacrament. Likewise, here on the Solemn Feast of Corpus Christi, when I reflect on the incredible gift we are given in receiving the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ that same unworthiness becomes far more than I can comprehend.

As we consider today, you may recall that this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to “Body of Christ.” This feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and as extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. We need to hold onto. At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church. In all of this, my prayer becomes for each of us, as we
