Pastor's Column

To the Parishioners of Our Lady of Lourdes & St. Michael:

Right now, Christian education is on my brain. Seeing all our children again on Sunday morning, the mild (and holy) chaos of first day, teachers learning names, trying to find chairs, showing off our new paint job and paintings along the hallway, hearing the kids recite prayers that maybe they don't know, all this and more is no accident. Our teachers (and Deacon Morris) are gifts; our little ones are gifts, staff rushing out and getting more chairs...we are in this together and we cooperate with God for the spread of his kingdom. Together, family and Church must work together to pass on a faith that has meaning. And this got me thinking...I came across this quote in my reading this

past week:

"Catholicism is a cosmological religion, that is, one that integrates all the phenomena of space and time into a sacred order in which divine and human existence are continuous. This cosmology locates and explains man's existence. For the Catholic, therefore, religion is not private and autonomous but communitarian and cosmic. Every aspect of existence is explained a part of an eternal benevolent continuity. For the Catholic, suffering is rescued from absurdity by being seen as a valuable co-operation with the suffering of the Son of God on the Cross, and Christ's suffering in turn is seen as the Atonement, [which] only the Son of God (Continued on Page 2)

made man, could offer for the original sin of Adam." That quote, which seems like a mouthful, really is not that difficult. First, we need a couple of definitions. "Cosmological," means metaphysics that treats the character of the universe (all space in the cosmos, including all universes, black holes, heaven and everything in between) as an orderly system including the processes of nature. "Catholic" means universal and/or general. The Eastern Christian churches broke away in 1054, and the protestant revolution happened in the early 1400's; but still, to be Christian from the early days of Jerusalem was to be "Catholic;" it was truly universal, it was *the* Church. That is what we are truly a part of.

In other words, we Catholics are a faith that believes God created the world, the heavens and the earth, and that this is orderly, and all parts, are sacred and has meaning. "Communitarian" is an old-style word meaning community, with a commonality of interests and relationships. In short, we all believe, and more to the point, we all believe *together*; we are in this together. What the Catholic Church proposes to the world is view of a universal faith in God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit, who created the world, everything has meaning, everything has purpose, even all that "stuff" that we don't understand.

And when we "cooperate" with God that means we worship together in the most important act we can possibly do: participate in heart and mind, body and soul, in the re-presentation of the sacrifice of Calvary on the Altar each week. When we adults (which means everyone one of us is also a "teacher"); when we truly understand what the Mass is and means, everything in our life changes. What we pray is truly what (I hope) we believe. Yes, I know not everything is perfect, but because we are together, we volunteer, we offer, we sacrifice in ways we have not thought of so that our understanding of the cross is that much more deeper. And when our faith deepens, there will be a clarity to life not seen. Our faith is supernatural, it is cosmic, it is sacramental, it is eternal, it has purpose, it is communal, it is joyful, it is life-giving, it is sacred, it is the Mass. Together, let us pass our love of the Mass on to the other; the next generation.

40 Days For Life Starts Wednesday

WHAT: 40 days for life is an international campaign of prayer, sacrifice and education to end abortion around the world.

WHEN: The 40 day period starts on September 23 and ends on November 1.

WHERE: Peaceful prayer vigils will be held in 307 cities around the world. The local prayer vigil will be held from 7 AM to 6 PM in the public sidewalk in front of Planned Parenthood at 412 D.B. Todd Blvd. in Nashville. All participants must sign a statement of peace pledging to conduct themselves in a calm and prayerful manner. Prayer participants should think of themselves as being like Mary at the foot of the cross of Jesus.

WHO: Everyone is welcome to participate. To sign up for a time slot go to www.40daysforlife/nashville. Legion of Mary members Nathan Smith and Teresa Dean will be representing Our Lady of Lourdes on Thursdays during the campaign in Nashville. People who are interested in joining them, should call Teresa Dean at 615-517-1864.

WHY: To beg God's forgiveness and assistance to end the loss of innocent life; to bear a public witness for the unborn and testify to their humanity; to save lives; and to offer love and hope to those facing crisis pregnancies or in need of healing from abortions.
